

Dear Lacrosse Enthusiast:

Thank you for your interest in nominating a candidate to the National Lacrosse Hall of Fame. Attached you will find a Nomination Questionnaire which should be completed as comprehensively as possible. This questionnaire may be completed by a nominee or on his/her behalf.

Although additional documentation may be attached to the questionnaire when it is returned to the US Lacrosse, separate documentation will not replace a completed questionnaire. A fully-completed questionnaire is the most important element of a nominee's candidacy.

Also, you are strongly advised to include the names, addresses and phone numbers of two or three additional references for the candidate for use by the appropriate nominee committee.

The Men's and Women's Nominating Committees meet independently each Spring to evaluate all candidates. The committee chairs then present nominees to the US Lacrosse Board of Directors at its June meeting. Formal induction of those elected occurs at a black tie affair held in the fall.

The ever-increasing stature of National Lacrosse Hall of Fame selection has resulted in an additional strategy to increase nominee visibility -- excessive lobbying. The committees are responsible for seeking out additional information on a particular candidate, if necessary. The public is, therefore, requested not to contact the Men's and Women's Hall of Fame Nominating Committee members to lobby for a particular candidate. However, the nominating committee chairs welcome your inquiries regarding the process.

Once again, thank you for your critical role in this process, and do not hesitate to contact the US Lacrosse with any questions that you may have.

NOMINATION CRITERIA

Nominees to the National Lacrosse Hall of Fame are evaluated based upon the following categories. Each category represents the highest degree of excellence and dedication to the game of lacrosse.

- 1) A truly great player who has contributed noteworthy service to the game of lacrosse over the years.
- 2) A truly great player.
- 3) A truly great coach who has contributed noteworthy service to the game of lacrosse over the years.
- 4) An outstanding player, who was also an outstanding coach or official, who has contributed noteworthy service to the game of lacrosse over the years.
- 5) A truly great coach.
- 6) A player who has made a truly great contribution to society.
- 7) An individual who has demonstrated long, dedicated and exceptional service to the game. (No more than one nominee per year may be inducted under this category).
- 8) A qualified individual whose career was completed at least forty years prior to the current year and who, in the committee's opinion, has been overlooked or forgotten.

QUALIFIED CANDIDATES

In order to be considered for nomination to the National Hall of Fame, candidates must fulfill the following criteria:

- * A Nominee Questionnaire must be submitted by, or on behalf of, each candidate.
- * A candidate must possess character beyond reproach.
- * At least fifteen years must have elapsed since a candidate's normal or projected college/university graduation. (College attendance is not a prerequisite for consideration.)

EVALUATION PROCESS

Each spring, the National Hall of Fame Nomination Committees meet to review each National Hall of Fame Nominee Questionnaire filed to date and all accompanying support material. Top-30 lists are then determined and distributed to select lacrosse enthusiasts, including the media, current and past coaches, and members of the National Lacrosse Hall of Fame. This group is then asked to rank the top fifteen candidates in order. These rankings are tabulated and used as a guide by the National Hall of Fame Nomination Committees. A final slate of nominees is then presented by each nomination committee to the US Lacrosse Board of Directors at its June meeting. A maximum of five men and five women may be elected in any one year. Candidates must receive a 75% vote in order to be elected. Electees are notified via overnight letter. Formal induction ceremonies take place in November.
