

# III. 2005-06 Girls Volleyball Series Terms and Conditions



In accordance with Section 1.450 of the IHSA Constitution, the Board of Directors has approved the Terms and Conditions governing the 2005-06 IHSA Class A and Class AA Girls Volleyball Tournament Series.

# SCHOOL CLASSIFICATION

I.

Competition in the IHSA Class A and AA Girls Volleyball Tournament Series will be held for all member schools without classification.

- A. The classification of a school shall be determined on the basis of its total student enrollment figure reported to the Illinois State Board of Education in its Fall Housing Report on September 30 of the preceding school year. (Example: The total student enrollment figure included in the Fall Housing Report on September 30, 2004, shall be used for determining a school's classification during the 2005-06 school year.)
- **B.** For classification purposes, the total student enrollments for one-year high schools, two-year high schools, three-year high schools and high schools which enroll boys only or girls only shall be calculated as follows:
- For one-year high schools, the total student enrollment figure reported shall be quadrupled.
- For two-year high schools, the total student enrollment figure reported shall be doubled.
- For three-year high schools, onethird of the total student enrollment figure shall be added to the total student enrollment figure reported.
- For schools, which enroll boys only or girls only, the total student enrollment figure reported shall be doubled.
- C. A multiplier of 1.65 will be added to all non-boundaried schools with an enrollment of 450 and above.
- **D.** Schools participating in sports and activities operating under the two-class system shall be classified as follows:
- 1. Schools with adjusted enrollments of 735 and below will be Class A.
- 2. Schools with adjusted enrollments above 735 will be Class AA.
- 3. During the 2005-06 school term, the following sports and activities shall operate under this system: boys baseball, boys basketball, boys cross country, boys golf, boys soccer, boys track and field, boys wrestling, girls basketball, girls cross country, girls soccer, girls softball, girls track and field, girls volleyball, and Scholastic Bowl.
- 4. Classifications shall be determined on an annual basis.

## II. DATES AND SITES

- A. Class A Regionals: The Class A Regional Preliminary matches shall be held on Monday, October 24, 2005. The Class A Regional Semifinal matches shall be held on Tuesday, October 25, 2005 and the Class A Regional Championship matches shall be held on Thursday, October 27, 2005.
- **B.** Class AA Regionals: The Class AA Regional Preliminary matches shall be held on Tuesday, October 25, 2005. The Class AA Regional Semifinal matches shall be held on Wednesday, October 26, 2005 and the Class AA Regional Championship matches shall be held on Saturday, October 29, 2005.
- C. Class A/AA Sectionals: The Sectional Semifinal matches shall be held on Tuesday, November 1, 2005. The Sectional Final matches shall be held on Thursday, November 3, 2005
- D. Class A/AA Super-Sectionals: The Super-Sectional matches shall be held on Monday, November 7, 2005.
- E. Class A/AA State Final: The Quarterfinal, Semifinal and Final round matches of the State Final tournaments shall be played on Friday-Saturday, November 11-12, 2005, at Illinois State University in Redbird Arena. The State Final will be hosted by the ISU Department of Athletics.

## III. ON-LINE LIST OF PARTICIPANTS, WITHDRAWAL PROCEDURE, ELIGIBILITY, AND AFFIRMATIVE ACTION

The policy for Original Entry Deadlines, Late Entries, and Late Withdrawals shall be the policies and procedures regarding entry for all IHSA-sponsored sport/activities included in the 2005-2006 Entry Booklet.

A. Entries: All member schools must enter their school into the state series competition through the IHSA Schools Center on the IHSA Website at www.ihsa.org. The deadline for entry is September 1, 2005. All member schools should have received, in the mail in April of 2005, a 2005-2006 Entry Booklet that outlines the on-line entry procedures for all IHSA-sponsored tournaments.

The IHSA Board of Directors has eliminated the entry fees for all sports and activities starting with the 2005-2006 school year.

B. Late Entries: Any attempt to enter a sport or activity on-line after the established deadlines will be denied. Schools that wish to enter after the deadline will be considered late. To be considered for late entry, the Principal/Official Representative must contact the IHSA administrator in charge of that sport or activity. The penalty for late entry shall be a

payment of \$100.00 for that sport/activity by the school.

C. Breach of Contract By-Law 6.041: To withdraw without penalty, the Principal must notify the IHSA Office, in writing, of the school's withdrawal from the respective sport prior to the seeding meeting date and/or the date the List of Participants is due for that sport.

If a school withdraws after the seeding meeting date/List of Participants due date but before the first competition, the school will be charged a \$100 penalty and, if applicable, the cost of game officials and the host school guarantee provided for in the Terms & Conditions.

If a school does not officially withdraw prior to the first competition and/or does not show up for competition, the school will be charged a \$100 penalty, the cost of game officials and the host school guarantee according to the Terms & Conditions for the respective sport.

- **D. Eligibility:** All member schools in good standing may enter one team under the provisions of IHSA By-law 3.054.
- **E.** Affirmative Action: Only girls shall be permitted to participate in the state series except as provided in the IHSA Affirmative Action Policy.
- F. On-Line List of Participants: The online List of Participants does not apply to team sports.

# IV. HOST FINANCIAL ARRANGEMENTS

# A. Host School Financial Arrangements:

- 1. Regional Host: The host school shall pay for all local expenses and issue checks to game officials and line judges. Each host shall receive a guarantee of \$230.00 per night of competition and shall be reimbursed the cost of officials. The host shall retain 20% of the net income and submit the remainder to the IHSA. In the event of a negative balance, the host shall be reimbursed the entire deficit. If admission is not charged, the host shall forfeit the guarantee.
- 2. Sectional Host: The host school shall pay for all local expenses and issue checks to the game officials and line judges. Each host shall receive a guarantee of \$540.00 plus \$70.00 for conducting a sectional complex seeding meeting and shall be reimbursed the cost of officials. The host shall retain 20%of the net income and submit the remainder to the IHSA. In the event of a negative balance, the host shall be reimbursed the entire deficit. If admission is not charged, the host shall forfeit the guarantee.
- 3. Super-Sectional Host: The host school shall pay for all local expenses and issue checks to the game officials and line judges. Each host shall receive a guarantee of \$310.00 and shall be reimbursed the cost of officials. The host shall retain 20% of the net income and

submit the remainder to the IHSA. In the event of a negative balance, the host shall be reimbursed the entire deficit. If admission is not charged, the host shall forfeit the guarantee.

Season Tickets for Regionals/Sectionals: Local managers of regional and/or sectional tournaments in which two (2) or more sessions are conducted may sell season tickets as well as session tickets. If the local manager exercises this option, season ticket prices will be the same as the single-session price multiplied by the number of sessions. There is no discount price for season tickets.

#### TOURNAMENT ASSIGNMENTS AND V. SEEDING MEETINGS

- A. Tournament Series: The successive tournament series shall be designated respectively as regional, sectional, supersectional and state final. The IHSA Office will select all regional, sectional and super-sectional host sites. All schools including the Chicago Public Schools, entered in the Class A and Class AA state series will be assigned to a sectional complex based on geography.
- B. Sectional Complex Seeding: IHSA will designate the sectional and subsectional host sites to conduct a seeding meeting for the purpose of seeding. The seeding meeting shall be held on Wednesday, October 5, 2005 between the hours of 5:00 p.m. and 8:00 p.m. The Sectional Manager will set the start time.

- C. Season Summary Sheet: A coach is required to submit a season summary sheet to his/her sectional manager no later than the Monday prior to the sectional complex seeding meeting. Failure to do so will result in a school forfeiting its opportunity to participate in the voting process. The season summary sheet can be located on the IHSA girl's volleyball website's form section.
- D. Seeding Meeting: One (1) coach or official school representative attending the meeting and whose school has submitted the season summary sheet shall have one vote. No coach shall vote for his/her own team. Seeding shall occur at the sectional complex level. Neither the super-sectional nor the state final shall be seeded. Seeds shall be determined and justified if needed, based on the teams total win/loss record, head-to-head victories and record against common opponents.
- E. Guidelines for Seeding for Bracketed Team Sports: Seeding shall occur only at the lowest level of competition, and therefore, neither the super-sectionals nor the state final shall be seeded. No seeded group shall consist of more than 24 teams. For sectional complexes involving more than 24 schools, this will require splitting the complex into two sub-complexes that are seeded independently. If any sectional complex in a given state series consists of more than 24 schools, then all complexes in that series will be split into sub-complexes. The coaches of schools shall do the seeding and an objective computer-based system shall be used to pair the teams. When the maximum size of a sectional complex is 15 or less, 4 schools shall be seeded, while larger sectional complexes shall seed 8 schools. If any sectional in a complex is seeding 8 teams, then all sectional complexes in that state series shall seed 8 teams. The remaining teams will be placed in the brackets based on geography with no more than two (2) of the top eight (8) teams being assigned to any one (1) regional in a sectional complex. The remaining seeds will then be assigned geographically to a regional. In all cases, the host school will be assigned to its own regional. Once the teams have been assigned to a regional, the sectional seeds will be used to place the teams in the regional bracket. The pairings for the sectional will be based on the sectional complex seeds with theoretically 1 v 4, 2 v 3, 1 v 2 format. Super-Sectional and state final pairings will be made by a chance public draw by the IHSA Office.
- F. State Series Pairings: The Class A and Class AA pairings will be made by the IHSA and posted on the IHSA web site no later than Friday, October 7, 2005.

#### TOURNAMENT STRUCTURE AND VI. TIME SCHEDULES

A. Playing Order: No local manager is authorized to change the dates of the matches played as determined by the IHSA Office. Following the seeding meeting, no local manager is authorized to change either the time or order of the matches.

#### B. Time Schedules:

- 1. Regional, Sectional, Super-Sectional: In a three (3) match preliminary contest, the playing times shall be 5:30 p.m., 6:30 p.m. and 7:30 p.m. The playing order shall have the highest seeded team playing at 6:30 p.m. In a two (2) match contest the highest seeded team shall play at 6:30 p.m.
- 2. Regional and Sectional Championship Matches: The championship match for the girl's regional finals and the girls sectional finals may be played between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m.
- 3. Super-Sectional: One match contest shall be played at 7:00 p.m.
- 4. State Final: The time schedule for the state finals will be flip-flopped yearly.

#### VII. ADVANCEMENT OF WINNERS

A. Class A: The winners of the sixty-four (64) regional tournaments shall advance to sixteen (16) sectional tournaments consisting of four teams each. The winners of the sixteen (16) sectional tournaments shall advance to eight (8) super-sectional matches consisting of two teams each. The winners of the eight (8)

super -sectional tournaments shall advance to the state final tournament.

**B.** Class AA: The winners of the sixty-four (64) regional tournaments shall advance to sixteen (16) sectional tournaments consisting of four teams each. The winners of the sixteen (16) sectional tournaments shall advance to eight (8) super-sectional matches consisting of two teams each. Winners of the eight (8) super-sectional matches shall be entered in the state final tournament.

#### VIII. TOURNAMENT RULES

- A. Rules of Play: The current Volleyball Rules as published by the National Federation of State High School Associations are the official rules for all tournament matches except as stated in these Terms and Conditions or in printed instructions received from the IHSA Office.
- **B. Rally Scoring:** By state association adoption, a match will consist of the best 2 (two) out of 3 (three) games. Each game, including the deciding game, will be played to 25 points (no cap).
- C. Libero: The libero player will be used. Refer to the NFHS rulebook, the IHSA School and Managers Manual along with the IHSA girl's volleyball web page for details.
- **D. Official Wilson Volleyballs:** The Wilson Reaction volleyball H7500XDEF shall be used in the state tournament series. Wilson Sporting Goods shall provide volleyballs for each level of the state series and only Wilson volleyballs may be used.
- **E. Home Team:** Throughout the tournament series, the home team shall be the team on the top line of a playing schedule bracket; the visiting team is the team on the bottom of a playing schedule bracket.
- **F. Team Bench:** The home team shall select its team bench. Teams shall occupy the benches located on the side of the net adjacent to their playing area throughout the match.
- **G.** Warm ups: During warm ups players must be in a team uniform or a warm up shirt that has the visible uniform number.
- H. Line Judges: Local Tournament Managers will provide two (2) line judges for each match. Line judges must be at least 16 years of age and may not be a member of a school's girl's volleyball team that is in season. It is recommended that line judges be adults and be attired in a white short sleeve polo shirts, dark slacks and black or white shoes and socks. The IHSA Office will appoint two line judges for each match in the State Final tournament.
- I. Team Roster and Personnel: In each of the tournaments, a participating school shall not have more than fifteen (15) eligible players on the roster, in team uniform playing or warming up. Players listed on the roster are eligible to compete in that day's tournament. The roster of players may change from tournament to tournament in the state series. No more than 22 coaches, players, support personnel may be in the team bench area.
- J. Pre-Match Procedures: A maximum of 25 minutes shall be provided between matches in the tournament series. The coin-

- toss of the captains shall take place prior to the 5-5-5-2 pre-match warm-up session. The prematch warm-up period shall consist of the first 5 minutes both teams on their respective sides of the net will be allowed to warm up with ballhandling skills. The next 5 minutes will consist of the visiting team being allowed to practice on the full court (the home team is allowed to ballhandling outside the playing court if space allows). The next 5 minutes the home team will be allowed to practice on the full-court (the visiting team is allowed to practice ball-handling outside the playing court if space allows). The final 2 minutes both teams will be allowed on the playing court serving. Ball handling is permitted prior to the pre-match warm-ups. Teams shall be allowed to do ball handling skills on their side of the playing court before the clock is started for the pre-match warm-ups.
- K. Assignment of Officials: The Referees and Umpires for all tournament series matches will be assigned by the IHSA Office as stipulated in the current "IHSA Sports Officials Handbook." Host school will assign line judges.

#### IX. TOURNAMENT POLICIES

#### A. Pre-Sale Tickets:

- 1. Competing Schools: Schools competing in a State Final Tournament session will have an opportunity to purchase tickets in advance for that session, at their school.
- 2. Refunds: Under no circumstances shall there be a refund of ticket money for tickets sold in advance for the State Final even when tournament sessions are postponed. Tickets purchased in advance shall be good for the session when it is held.
- **B. All-Star Teams:** No tournament management, game officials, nor anyone serving under the supervision of the Illinois High School Association, may cooperate in any way in the selection of an all-star tournament team for the regional, sectional or super-sectional tournaments.
- C. State Final Passes: Teams assigned to regional/sectional complexes shall not be given passes to any correlated sectional tournament or super-sectional. For the state final tournament matches, each super-sectional winner will receive 22 passes for its 15 players and other team personnel for the state final tournament. In addition, a school will be provided 1 (one) athletic training pass for a school that brings a certified athletic trainer. The team bench area shall be restricted to the players and team personnel who have been issued a pass.
- D. Bands: The host school is allowed to have a band play before matches and during intermission. Members of the band may be given free admission. Band instruments shall not be used for cheering purposes. No band other than the one from the host school shall be admitted as an organization unless approved by the IHSA if requested by the local manager. At Redbird Arena and at the state finals, 60 band members in addition to 1 band director will be admitted into the tournament free of charge. Bands will be selected by the IHSA.

- **E. Artificial Noisemakers:** Mechanical noisemaking devices such as air horns and whistles shall be excluded from the gymnasium. In addition, any noisemaking devices that interfere with the competition shall be prohibited.
- **F. Signs and Banners:** The display of signs, banners, placards or similar items at IHSA state series events is permitted, provided they:
- 1. Are in good taste and reflect good sportsmanship in their message and use,
- Reflect identification and encouragement to participants and their school/community,
- 3. Are not displayed on the field of play in a manner, which interferes with play,
- Do not obstruct the view of participants or spectators and;
  - 5. Are not safety hazards.
- **G.** Cheerleaders and Mascots: No pompon squads or drill team groups shall perform at any tournaments. Cheerleaders of participating schools are allowed.
- H. Damage to Property or Equipment: If contestants or people from any school entered in a state series are found guilty of carelessness or maliciously breaking, damaging or destroying property or equipment belonging to the host school, such school shall be held responsible for costs incurred in replacing or repairing such property or equipment.
- I. Practice Sessions: In the regional, sectional, super-sectional and state final tournament matches, the host school shall not make its gymnasium available to the visiting teams for practice sessions. Teams participating in the State Final tournaments will be permitted to practice in Redbird Arena on the Thursday prior to the state tournament. In addition, a school may make arrangements to use facilities at an area high school during the days of the State Final tournament.

# J. Media Requirements:

# 1. Provide Space:

Space shall be set aside to provide for news media representatives covering the state series whether they are from newspapers, radio stations, commercial television stations and/or cable television stations.

2. Radio and TV Originators:

- It is the responsibility of the Local Manager to accept applications, approve requests to originate, collect proper rights fees payments (where required) and make cancellation refunds for television and/or radio play-by-play origination's, according to IHSA Television and/or IHSA Radio Broadcast Policy.
- a. Television Rights Fees for all levels of competition below the State Final level shall be paid to the host school and shall become part of the revenue to be shared by the member school(s) and the Association according to the financial terms stipulated in these Terms and Conditions.
- b. Radio Broadcast Rights Fees are not required for any level of competition in this series (except State Final). Local Managers shall permit radio play-by-play originations of the competition.

- c. Television and/or Radio Stations which do not apply in advance, or which do not pay required rights fees prior to the start of competition in each respective level in this state series shall not be given credentials nor allowed access to the facility to originate. Sponsors of the originations for television and radio shall be only those so stipulated in the respective IHSA Television and Broadcast policies.
- 3. All media requirements for the State Final tournament shall be handled through the IHSA Office.
- 4. Local tournament managers shall be responsible for reporting tournament information and results to the IHSA Office and the news media as stipulated in printed instructions received from the IHSA Office.
- K. Videotaping by Schools and/or Spectators: Videotaping will be allowed provided the local managers have a comparable area for both competing schools to videotape. When one school requests the video space, then the local manager shall provide similar space to both competing schools. Non competing schools and spectators will be allowed to videotape matches in the stands, provided they do not obstruct the view of participants and spectators.

## L. Flash Photography:

- 1. During the match, no flash cameras can be used by spectators.
- 2. Strobe lighting by the news media can be used if the Manager has conferred with both coaches who give permission.
- 3. News media photographers are allowed to use electronic flashes. Should the manager and game official agree that the flashes are causing interference with the conduct of the contest, then they can require the photographer to cease use of the flash.
  - 4. The Manager's decision is final.
- M. Tobacco Products: No coach, player or any other person connected with a team shall be permitted to use tobacco products on the courts at tournament series facilities.
- N. Use of Inhalers: A student with asthma may possess and use her medication while under the supervision of school personnel, provided the school meets the outlined procedures of self administration in the Illinois school code.
- O. Alcoholic Beverages and IHSA State Series Events: The possession, distribution, sale and/or consumption of alcoholic beverages are prohibited at the site and on any affiliated property of any IHSA state series contest. State series hosts are required to make all state series contest sites and any affiliated property, including parking lots, fan accommodation areas, and other school or event venue property, alcohol free zones on the date or dates of any IHSA event being held at the site. Violation of this policy by an event host will subject the host to a penalty for violation of IHSA By-law 2.020. Such penalty may include but not necessarily be limited to prohibition against subsequent event hosting assignments. Violation of this policy by a non-hosting member school will subject the school to penalty for violation of IHSA By-law

- 2.020. Patrons of any IHSA state series contest determined to be in violation of this policy will be removed from the premise, and law enforcement officials will be called as warranted. No ticket refunds will be granted in such cases.
- P. The Sectional and Super-Sectional Team Reimbursements: Each school participating in any regional tournament match will be responsible to pay all expenses related to the team. In the sectional and super-sectional tournaments, each participating team shall be allowed transportation expenses at the rate of five dollars (\$5.00) per mile for the first fifty (50) miles and three dollars (\$3.00) per mile for each mile after fifty (50) miles for one round trip to the tournament site on each day the team participates in the sectional or super-sectional.
- Q. State Final Team Reimbursements: In the State Final tournaments, the participating teams shall be allowed transportation expenses at the rate of five dollars (\$5.00) per mile per team for one round-trip to and from the center where the State Final tournaments will be played. In addition, each team that participates in the State Final tournaments shall receive a flat team expense allowance. A team traveling 0-150 round trip miles to the state final site shall receive a \$750.00 reimbursement. A team traveling 151-300 round trip miles to the state final site shall receive a \$1,850.00 reimbursement. A team traveling over 300 round trip miles to the state final site shall receive a \$2,700.00 reimbursement.

Neither the State Association nor the local tournament management will assume responsibility for any other team expenses of any kind except those expenses specified above. Schools entering the tournament series must be ready to assume responsibility for unusual expenses due to accident, inclement weather, fire, theft or any other extraordinary cause.

R. Housing: Housing will be reserved by the IHSA for the teams participating in the State Final tournament. Schools participating in the State Final tournament will have an opportunity to state whether or not they will use the housing reserved for them by the IHSA Office. If schools elect to use the reserved housing, they must accept the housing assigned by the IHSA Office. If schools do not elect to use the reserved housing, they will be responsible for making their own housing arrangements for the State Final tournament.

#### X. AWARDS

- A. Team: The IHSA will furnish a plaque to the winning teams of the regional, sectional, and super-sectional tournaments. Trophies will be presented to the first, second, third and fourth place teams at the state final tournament.
- **B. Individual:** Twenty (20) medallions will be presented to players, coaches and other team members of the first, second, third and fourth place teams at the state tournament. In addition, a Superintendent's medallion, a Principal's medallion and an Athletic Director's medallion will be awarded to each of the four placing teams.

C. Additional Awards: No other trophies or awards of any kind may be presented at the tournaments unless approved by the Board of Directors.

#### XI. OFFICIALS

## A. Appointment and Fees:

- 1. Regional Fee: In the preliminary, quarterfinal, semifinal and final regional tournaments, each Referee and Umpire shall receive a fee of \$44.00 per match. Line judges shall receive a fee of \$10.00 per match worked.
- 2. Sectional Fee: In the sectional tournaments, each Referee and Umpire appointed by the IHSA shall receive a fee of \$62.00 per match. Line judges shall receive a fee of \$10.00 per match worked.
- 3. Super-Sectional Fee: In the super-sectional matches, each Referee and Umpire shall receive a fee of \$84.00 per match. Line judges shall receive a fee of \$10.00 for the match.
- 4. State Fee and Lodging: In the state final matches, each appointed Referee and Umpire shall receive a flat fee of \$442.00 (\$110.50 per match worked.). Each Line Judge shall receive a flat fee of \$84.50. In addition, each official and line judge who actually incurs an overnight lodging expense and uses the assigned housing, shall receive a \$60.00 lodging allowance for each of the three (3) nights lodging upon receipt and approval from the IHSA Administrator.
- 5. State Final Officials Coordinator: The Class A Officials Coordinator shall receive \$125.00 a day. In addition, the coordinator shall receive an overnight lodging expense at the assigned housing of \$60.00 per night for a maximum of three (3) nights upon receipt and approval from the IHSA Administrator. The Class AA Official Coordinator shall receive \$125.00 a day. In addition, the coordinator shall receive an overnight lodging expense at the assigned housing of \$60.00 per night for a maximum of three (3) nights upon receipt and approval from the IHSA Administrator.
- B. Mileage Reimbursement Policy: In the state series, to assist officials for out-of-pocket expenses, a voucher system will be used to compensate officials when they actually drive in excess of 100 miles round trip per contest. Payment will be made through the IHSA Office, after completion of the tournament series, at a rate of twenty cents (\$.25) per mile for all mileage in excess of 100 miles round trip. No compensation will be permitted for trips of less than 100 miles round trip per contest.
