RULES FOR COMPLETION OF PARENTS' FINANCIAL STATEMENT (PFS)

For Married Parents: Complete one application with both parents' information, mail to SSS, and send a copy to the School. The additional documentation listed above is mailed to the School.

For Divorced, Separated, or Never-Married Parents: Each natural parent must seperately complete an individual application and mail it to SSS with copy sent to the School. Each natural parent mails the additional documentation listed above separately to the School.

For Single Parent: If one parent is uninvolved in the child's life and has been for some time, the family must provide the School with a statement to this effect from a lawyer, member of the clergy, school official, or other third party who in a professional capacity is aware of the situation. One application is completed by the custodial parent and mailed to SSS with copy to the School. The additional documentation listed above is mailed to the School.
