1. CHEERLEADERS

Desirable Behavior - Show leadership ability to direct, control, and lead their cheering section in a positive manner; courtesy toward officials and all representative of opposing schools; greet visiting cheerleaders; actively welcome opponents with signs, cheer, personal greetings.

<u>Unacceptable Behavior</u> - Derogatory or disrespectful signs, yells, chants, screaming, songs or gestures; failure to share timeouts with opposing cheerleaders; being in inappropriate places at inappropriate times so as to interfere with the game, the officials, the coach or the spectators.

2. STUDENT BODY

Desirable Behavior- Cheers for own team in a positive manner at appropriate times; displays appreciation for good performance regardless of the team; positively encourages peers to display only sportsmanlike conduct.

<u>Unacceptable Behavior</u>- Displays of anger, taunting, boasting, or profanity; holding up newspapers, bouncing beach balls or other antics to draw attention; holding signs that block view of spectators or bear unsportsmanlike message; distracting or disruptive behavior while opponent attempts free throw; continually standing and blocking view of spectators; throwing anything onto the court.

3.PLAYERS

Desirable Behavior - Applauds along with spectators during introduction of players, coaches, and officials; shakes hands with opponents before/after the game; accept decisions and respectfully address officials during the contest and thanks them for their performance regardless of agreement with all calls; exercises self-control.

Unacceptable Behavior -Displays of temper; derogatory remarks or gestures; arguing with an official's call; intentional fouls; taunting opponents before, during, or after the contest.

4. COACHES/BENCHES PERSONNEL

Desirable Behavior - Coach remains seated on the bench or in chair unless standing within the coaching box (coach only); sticks to doing his job and lets the officials do theirs; assumes the responsibility of being a role model by exercising self-control; shakes hands with opponents before/after contest; uses positive encouragement.

Unacceptable Behavior - Blames loss on officials or other rationalizations; displays temper or anger; argues with official's call; displays antics showing lack of self-control; removes team from court or playing field before end of contest.

5. SUPPORT GROUPS (BAND, DRILL, PEP, etc.)

Desirable Behavior. - Arrange to share timeouts, etc. so as to not perform at the same time and not monopolize the opportunities to perform; performing groups agree in advance when to perform so that each will have sufficient time; band may play opponent's alma mater if only one band is present; support groups act in a positive way and do not detract from the contest in progress.

Unacceptable Behavior - Degrading or derogatory actions or words toward opponents; screaming or disconcerting actions during opponents' free throws; music being played after opponent's band or cheerleaders have begun a song or cheer; criticizes coaches, players or officials.

6. ADULT SPECTATORS

Desirable Behavior - Positive encouragement and support of own team without being rude, negative, or derogatory to opponents; recognize a good performance by either team; learn yells of cheerleaders and display unity as fans in following their lead.

Linacceptable Behavior- Booing, laughing, finger pointing, name calling of opponents; criticizing officials; profanity or degrading remarks; lack of self-control; taunting opponent while attempting free throws; coming out of stands to a place near or on court.

7. ADMINISTRATIVE SUPERVISION

Desirable Behavior. - Teaches the concept that the high school game is a part of the educational experience; has a plan for teaching, emphasizing, promoting and supporting good sportsmanship; is alert to dealing with large or small problems as they crop up; attends all events or delegates responsibility to be shared by other administrators; maintains control over student groups and seeks their support in the implementation of a sportsmanship program; serves as a role model for others.

Unacceptable Behavior- Criticizes or harasses officials vocally or in remarks to media, students, fans or opponents; shown lack of self-control; fails to intercede when unsportsmanlike situations occur.
