- This is in accordance with our policy to focus on Youth Bridge, something it is our intention to continue doing in the future, and especially in 2008 at the World Mind Sport Games

And what of 2008 ?

2008 will see the first ever World Mind Sport Games, to be held in Beijing. This is going to be a truly amazing event, bringing together some of the great Mind Sports with their own Champion players, while at the same time giving youngsters the chance to enter the arena with their own Championships and competitions.

The WBF is planning to invite as many Junior Pairs and Teams to Beijing as possible, and is hoping to be able to subsidise their travel costs as well as provide free, full board accommodation during their stay at the event. Whatever your role within bridge – whether you are a player, an official within a club, district or federation, a spectator or a writer, I am sure you can see that this event in Beijing is going to be a great opportunity for bridge. Please help us by trying to ensure that at least one youth team from each and every WBF member country joins is in October 2008, to affirm our belief that Junior Bridge is essential to the future of our great sport.
