DISTRIBUTION OF TROPHIES FOR MAY 6, 2006 YCCF 5TH ANNUAL AMERICAN HERITAGE SPRING CHESS CLASSIC – FINAL TOURNAMENT OF 2005/2006 CHESS SEASON IN BAKERSFIELD

We expect approximately 300 players and approximately 80 teams from various schools and clubs to participate. (Los Angeles County; Orange County; the Coast; and San Joaquin Valley are always well represented.

Please note changes in category prizes and Trophy distribution. There are now over 200 individual trophies and over 20 team trophies.

The YCCF 5th Annual American Heritage Spring Chess Classic will be held on May 6, 2006 at Cesar E. Chavez Elementary School located at 4201 Mesa Marin Drive, Bakersfield, CA 93306.

TROPHIES AND AWARDS IN EACH SECTION ARE AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. <u>All Participants in the K-1 section are awarded Trophies or Plaques</u>. This section also plays in an area separate from the main Tournament area.
- 2. In the Championship section Trophies or Plaques are awarded to the top 25 individuals in K-3 and K-6; top 20 in K-8; and top 10 in K-12.
- 3. Numerous category prizes are awarded to individuals who do <u>not</u> finish in the top 10 in K-12; Top 20 in K-8; and Top 25 in K-3 and K-6 in the Championship sections See following section on category prizes for unrated and selected USCF ratings for each section and Trophy distribution.
- 4. Trophies are awarded to the top 5 teams in each of 4 sections (K-1; K-3; K-6; and K-8). Trophies are awarded to top 3 teams in K-12 section.
- 5. Medals are awarded to all participants with 2 or more points, who do not otherwise receive a trophy.
- 6. Ribbons are awarded to all participants with less than 2 points.
