
The Outline:

Multi-levelling success

ulti-levelling – the opportunity for students to study subjects from any level of the curriculum – is increasing in New Zealand schools giving students who either excel in a subject or who need added support to work at that level without necessarily departing from their peer group.

Pakuranga College is one local school, at which multi-levelling has proved successful. Principal Heather McRae says in preparing students for their departure from school to university, a polytechnic or into the workplace, the college is focused on maximising achievement and equipping students with academic, practical and social skills to ensure their future success.

"We offer comprehensive academic and vocational programmes designed to meet a diverse range of needs and we encourage flexible entry to our wide-ranging, multiple pathways curriculum," Mrs McRae says.

"We encourage students to avail themselves of every opportunity to reach their full potential with multi-levelling giving them the opportunity to select subjects from any level



of the curriculum. For instance a student in year 10 who would traditionally not start NCEA until year 11 can begin to study NCEA level 1 in selected topics of their choice.

"This could be as part of an extension class (mostly year 10 students) or it could be that they join a level one class for that subject (mostly year 11 students). If they show real skill in a particular subject they may join a level Z NCEA class."

Examples of Pakuranga College students who have successfully multi-levelled include:

Joe Tsai – A Year 12 student last year, Joe has been selected to attend the University of Berkley in California this year rather than completing his Year 13 studies at Pakuranga College.

Robert Hoye – a Year 12 student this year, Robert is multi-levelling, studying at level three and also doing university level papers. In his Auckland University maths paper he achieved an A+. Robert, who was selected to join the Chemistry Olympiad Training Squad and has a chance to make a New Zealand team for the International Chemistry Olympiad in Hungary, will go straight from Year 12 to university next year.

Donald White – Donald is also a Year 12 student and is another who will attend university next year instead of completing Year 13 at Pakuranga College. Donald represented New Zealand at the International Young Physicists Tournament in Croatia achieving second place.

"While multi-levelling can help students advance their studies it can also assist those who may be achieving well in most areas of their normal level but need support and assistance in one or two areas."
