In addition to funding *L'Année philologique* and the *TLL* and Pearson fellowships, the Annual Fund also supports **Minority Scholarships**, which provide summer educational experiences for undergraduate students. In each of the past two years, we have been able to fund only three of 15-19 applications. **With your help, we can do more**.
